BIOGRAPHICAL NOTE: Research scientist, AIDS activist, co-founder of amfAR (Foundation for AIDS Research), and philanthropist. Mathilde Krim was best known for her work in promoting research to combat the spread of HIV/AIDS. Beginning in the early years of the disease, when its transmission and pathogenesis was less understood, she became one of the country's most visible advocates for the need to adequately fund research as well as an outspoken champion of the human rights and dignity of persons living with HIV/AIDS. Her work was instrumental in raising the alarm--both in the United States and globally--to address the escalating AIDS epidemic in the 1980s-2000s.

Born July 9, 1926 in Como, Italy as the first of four children to Rosa Krause and Eugene Emmanuel Galland, Mathilde Krim received her bachelor's degree (1948) and PhD (1953) from the University of Geneva and worked in cytogenetics at the Weizmann Institute of Science in Israel (1953-1959). She went on to research positions at Cornell University Medical College (1959-1962) and the Sloan-Kettering Institute for Cancer Research (SKI) (1962-1985) where she focused her research on the use of interferons to treat cancer, a type of immunotherapy that has been applied to treatments beyond cancer. She was part of the congressional advisory commission on the "war against cancer" in 1970. She led two international conferences on interferon held in New York City in 1975 and 1979 and served as a Fellow of the New York Academy of Sciences in 1977. She was a member of the President's Commission for the Study of Ethical Problems in Medicine and Biomedical and Behavioral Research in 1979-1981.

In 1981 she was named Director of the Interferon Lab at SKI when her work on interferons intersected with research on AIDS (Acquired Immune Deficiency Syndrome)—at the time, an unknown condition first noticed among gay men. By 1982, cases had also been identified among heterosexuals, particularly those engaged in intravenous drug use or who were recipients of blood transfusions, indicating that infection spread via blood regardless of gender or sexual orientation. In 1983, the virus causing AIDS was identified and by 1986 named HIV (Human Immunodeficiency Virus).

Krim, along with other scientists involved in researching the causes, cures, and treatments for the disease, founded the AIDS Medical Foundation (AMF) in 1983. In September 1985, AMF merged with newly established National Foundation for AIDS Research to form the American Foundation for AIDS Research (amfAR). In 2005, the organization truncated its name to Foundation for AIDS Research. Krim was Chair of the amfAR Board of Directors (1990-2004) and was a board member of other like-minded organizations, such as the National Biomedical Research Foundation, the Federation of Parents and Friends of Lesbians and Gays, and the African-American Institute.

In her personal life, she met medical student David Danon while also a student in Geneva, converted to Judaism and married in 1948. They had one daughter. After completing her PhD, Krim moved with her husband to Israel where she rose to become research associate at the Weizmann Institute. With Leo Sachs and other Weizmann scientists, Krim co-authored several papers important in the development of amniocentesis.

Krim divorced Danon in 1955. In 1958, she married Arthur B. Krim, a Columbia alumnus (B.A. 1930, J.D.1932) and Trustee (1967-1994), and motion picture executive (Chairman of United Artists 1951-1978). They resided in New York City.

Arthur Krim was also chairperson of the Democratic National Finance Committee (1966-1968) and the Democratic Advisory Council of Elected Officials (1973-1976). Active in philanthropy and fundraising for the Democratic Party, the Krims were friends with the elite and had the ear of important politicians, such as Presidents John F. Kennedy and Lyndon B. Johnson. These celebrity contacts later proved beneficial in bolstering the message of amfAR, particularly through fund-raising and lobbying. Arthur Krim died September 21, 1994.

Krim served on numerous boards, advisory groups, and task forces relating to her work as a research scientist and philanthropist. She was the recipient of many awards and honorary degrees, recognizing her contributions to science, AIDS activism and as a Jewish-American. She was awarded the U.S. Presidential Medal of Freedom by Bill Clinton in 2000.

Mathilde Krim was appointed Associate Research Scientist in the Mailman School of Public Health at Columbia University in 1986 and later became an adjunct professor of health policy there. She served on the Mailman School's Board of Overseers for many years and received an honorary degree from Columbia University in 1988. The University endowed the Dr. Mathilde Krim-amfAR Chair of Global Health professorship in 2015.

Mathilde Krim died January 15, 2018 at Kings Point, New York.

SCOPE & CONTENT: The Krim Papers document her life as a research scientist, AIDS activist, and philanthropist. The bulk consists of records created and material collected by Krim, her office assistant James Crowley, and amfAR employees and board members, and include printed-out email correspondence, letters, memoranda, notes, lists, reports, minutes, meeting materials, financial statements, grant applications, photographs, itineraries and other travel documents, agendas, informational brochures, and flyers and other printed works created by amfAR.

Questionnaires, reports, polls, correspondence, research and popular literature, manuscripts, speeches, interviews, congressional testimony, programs, conference proceedings, brochures, promotional material, videos and other records document the development of government policy and that of the national, international, and New York State organizations created to monitor and prevent the spread of HIV/AIDS. This involved AIDS surveillance, needle exchange programs, drug pricing, testing technology, vaccines and other investigational treatments.

AmfAR galas and other events—serving to both fund raise and increase awareness of the AIDS epidemic—are documented with photographs, invitations, programs, promotional material, notes and other planning records. Records documenting the relationship between Krim/amfAR and individuals and organizations involved with AIDS advocacy and research consist of information packets, correspondence, audiovisual works, photographs, brochures, reports, and publications. Also included are educational communications on the transmission and prevention of AIDS and the documentation of myriad organizations offering support services for HIV-positive persons and their families.

Besides her AIDS activism, the papers document Krim's work at Sloan-Kettering Institute – especially her interferon research – Cornell, Weizmann, Columbia University, as well as other professional activities. A smaller amount of letters, photographs, plaques, certificates, awards, and other materials document Krim's personal life – although much of her professional life spilled into personal life, particularly with amfAR.

ARRANGEMENT/ORGANIZATION: The collection is arranged into five series: I. Sloan-Kettering Institute for Cancer Research; II. amfAR; III. Personal; IV. Photographs; V. 2021 Accession.

**SERIES I. SLOAN-KETTERING INSTITUTE FOR CANCER RESEARCH, CIRCA 1958-1990
 BOXES 1-51, 172, 180 (14.7 CUBIC FEET)**

This series of records documents Krim's administrative and research related activities at SKI and contains correspondence, logbooks, memoranda, budgets and receipts.

Arranged into seven subseries: General, Interferon, Personnel, Rabies project, Research literature, Sound recordings, Subject files, and Workshops. Folders arranged in original order.

Records within folders often arranged in reverse chronological order. Researchers should be aware that additional records relating to interferon and the Sloan-Kettering Institute can be found in Series V.

Subseries are as follows:

Subseries 1.1: General (5 boxes, 1.75 cubic feet), 1969-1986

Contains CHI restricted files. See container list for details.

Institute annual reports, patient records, correspondence with staff, patient inquiries, grant applications, Krim's payroll records, guides, and other general administrative records that do not specifically fall into the remaining Subseries are found in this subseries. Some correspondence relates to inquiries about participating in or obtaining information about immunology and interferon studies conducted at the Cancer Center.

Subseries 1.2: Interferon Laboratory (13 boxes, 4.5 cubic feet), 1970s-1990

This subseries contains correspondence among staff, suppliers, consultants, patients, and other organizations, in addition to log books, lectures, reports, notes, expense statements, meeting materials, case reports, grants, research papers, and other records documenting the Interferon Laboratory activities, such as the interferon evaluation program, animal interferon research program, interferon bioassay research testing, and commercially available interferon and related products. Records document collaborations with other institutions and organizations, such as the International Laboratories for the Molecular Biology of Interferon Systems (ILMBIS), Israel Institute for Biological Research (IIBR), Salk Institute, and the New York Academy of Science.

Krim is credited for establishing the relationship between the University of Berne and Swiss Red Cross with Sloan-Kettering to supply white blood cells for use in SKI's interferon research.

Arranged further into sub-subseries:

Research papers arranged by topic. Folder titles were retained so may not match exact paper titles.

Subseries 1.3: Personnel (3 boxes, 1 cubic feet), 1975-1986

Most of these records are closed for 25 years after the individual's date of death. See container list for details.

Contains personnel records for student interns and staff for grants and research projects supervised by Krim, along with correspondence between Krim and her supervisors regarding employment.

Subseries 1.4: Rabies project (2.5 boxes, 1 cubic foot), 1972-1982

Contains correspondence, grant applications, agreements, curricula vitae, supplies' inventories, budgets, travel documents, and other materials documenting the National Institute of the Humanities (NIH) study, "Human Rabies: Intensive Care and Interferon Therapy" in collaboration with the Naval Medical Research Unit NAMRU-3 in Egypt.

Subseries 1.5: Research literature (5 boxes, 1.75 cubic feet), circa 1958-1980s

Contains research and academic papers, journals and other published articles, collected but not necessarily authored by Krim. The bulk are published papers, but includes a few manuscripts and letters. Of note is a copy of the manuscript, "Immunosuppression, opportunistic infections, and Kaposi's Sarcoma," by Joseph Sonnabend, describing the occurrence of this rare skin cancer, immune disorders and other symptoms seen in homosexual men and referred to as Sexually Associated Immunosuppressive Disease (SAID), circa 1982.

Arranged alphabetically by topic.

Subseries 1.6: Sound recordings (4 boxes, .5 cubic foot) 1960s-1980s

This subseries contains audio tape recordings, the bulk cassettes, and 5-inch and 7-inch reel-to-reel tapes recording the 1st and 2nd International Workshop on Interferon in the Treatment of Cancer (1975 and 1979, respectively). Includes a small amount of non-workshop and unidentified cassette tapes.

Of note is the cassette recording: *The doctor talks to you about understanding interferon: a discussion by Mathilde Krim, Ph.D.*

For access to these recordings, refer to the Access Note in finding aid.

Subseries 1.7: Subject files (5 boxes, 1.75 cubic feet), 1969-1988

Correspondence, promotional materials, information booklets, articles and other printed materials on various topics, organizations, and individuals in which Krim was involved. Records relating to the AMF and later amfAR, may overlap with these files. Some correspondence files which begin with Krim's SKI work but end during her AIDS Medical Foundation (AMF) and amfAR work are found in this series.

Arranged alphabetically.

Subseries 1.8: Workshops (12 boxes, 4.2 cubic feet), 1975-1980

This subseries contains records from the 1st International Workshop on Interferon in the Treatment of Cancer (1975 March 31-April 2, 1975), and the 2nd International Workshop on Interferons (1979 April 22-24), both initiated by Krim and held in New York City. Includes full and edited transcripts from the presentations, steering committee meetings and discussion groups, along with proofs and published agendas and reports. Includes invitations, form letters, manuscripts, Editing Committee correspondence, agendas, summaries, grant application, participant lists, and workshop feedback.

Workshop participants drew from hospitals, academic institutions, and pharmaceutical companies worldwide. Manuscripts include "Introductory Comments" (in folder: Monday

morning sessions, 1975) by Dr. Joseph Sonnabend, an interferon research scientist who later co-founded the AIDS Medical Foundation (AMF) with Krim.

Papers and transcripts arranged numerically by session or alphabetically by author. The second conference includes correspondence with industry contacts, arranged alphabetically. Audio records can be found in Subseries 1.5.

SERIES II. AMFAR, 1980s-2016 (32 cubic feet)

BOX NUMBERS 52-143, 172-173

This series documents Mathilde Krim's work as founding Chair of amfAR and contains administrative records, such as meeting minutes from Board of Trustees and internal committees and office files created by Krim and her office assistant, James Crowley. Includes inter-office correspondence between amfAR staff and external colleagues, collaborators, politicians, donors, and friends in the form of hand-written letters, computer printed documents, and printed-out emails. Contains printed materials from AIDS organizations, charitable foundations, lobbying groups, government agencies—such as the Centers for Disease Control (CDC), U.S. Food and Drug Administration, and U.S. Department of Health and Human Services – and academic institutions along with other organizations that represented causes and issues of interest to Krim.

This series documents Krim and amfAR's relationship with leading LGBTQ civil rights groups, such as ACT UP, PFLAG (Federation of Parents and Friends of Lesbians and Gays), GMHC (Gay Men's Health Crisis), Lambda Legal, and Gay and Lesbian Alliance Against Defamation (GLAAD), particularly shared efforts in fundraising through galas, auctions, and other events. The series naturally documents many individuals and groups sharing amfAR's mission in AIDS/HIV research, public health, education, fundraising, and patient advocacy. This includes relationships with pharmaceutical companies, such as Schering-Plough, lobbyists affecting US policy, the Drug Policy Alliance and global health groups, and the UN Scientific Advisory Committee (SAC).

The original order and filing system of these records changed over time so that files for some organizations and events may be located in different subseries. Krim's original filing scheme was retained with the knowledge that content may overlap in the subseries "Events," "Organizations" and/or "Subject files."

This series contains the following subseries:

Subseries 2.1: General (15 boxes, 5.25 cubic feet) 1986-2016

Meeting minutes are closed for 25 years from date of creation. This subseries contains Krim's amfAR administrative records including those from the Board of Directors and Trustees meetings (1997?-2016), Development Committee (1985-1990), Finance and Budget Committee (1985-1990), Science Policy Committee (1985-1990), and Public Policy Committee (2001-2004) and Program Board (2006), in addition to materials of a general scope, such as calendars, appointment books, newsletters, histories, manuals, policies, press releases, staff correspondence and other materials.

Loose and “miscellaneous” material was marked as “General” and arranged in chronological order. These files may contain Krim records not directly related to amfAR. These “General” files contain correspondence and other material from events and organizations such as Honoring with Pride and Gay Men’s Health Crisis, which may correspond to files found in other amfAR subseries.

Subseries 2.2: Correspondence (14 boxes, 5 cubic feet), 1985-2016

General correspondence arranged by Krim chronologically (1986-1993); correspondence and other records arranged as “Chronological files” (1999-2010); and incoming (1999-2016) and outgoing (2013-2016) chronological files.

Includes a few correspondence files labeled “important,” “thank-you,” and other purposes. Loose correspondence was titled “correspondence” and arranged chronologically.

Subseries 2.3: Events, (19 boxes, 6.7 cubic feet), 1986-2015

Contains events files (1986-1993) arranged by Krim in chronological order, along with files for similar events, galas, and organizations (1994-2015). The bulk of these records documents galas and fund-raising events sponsored by amfAR, such as their Annual Fall Dinner in San Francisco, Annual New York Gala, Honoring With Pride, Seasons of Hope, and Cinema Against AIDS. Unique concerts, tributes, and events featured artists, celebrities, and AIDS activists such as Elizabeth Taylor, Barry Manilow, Paul Simon, Mikhail Baryshnikov, Larry King, Patti LaBelle, Dionne Warwick, and others. Events also include collaborations with like-minded organizations, such as Two By Two for AIDS and Art and Gay Men’s Health Crisis (GMHC).

The records contain printed invitations, programs, auction catalogues, press releases and other promotional material, correspondence, internal memoranda, notes, itineraries, agendas, participants’ lists, travel documents, speeches (by Krim), donor records, and financial information. A small amount of photographs, digital, audio, and video recordings are found within event files, such as the video of G&P Charitable Foundation for Cancer Research Gala in 1998. See Series IV for additional photographs.

Includes meetings and amfAR events such as donor trips, Board dinners, amfAR grantee receptions, World AIDS Day Conferences, and other symposia and conferences. Includes non-amfAR events attended by Krim or to honor her, particularly speeches and presentations at universities, charitable foundations, academic symposia, and professional conferences. Of note are the meetings regarding newly identified HIV-related retroviruses, held in Geneva (February 11-12, 1987), U.S. Center for Disease Control conference on testing (February 24-25, 1987), the amfAR Clinical Trial Design workshop held in Chicago (April 29-30, 1991), and the Schering AZT/Intron A Phase II study meeting held in Dallas, Texas (August 1-2, 1991).

Of note are large programs from World AIDS Day: Masquerade (1989-1991); “amfAR Salutes the Carols: Benefit tribute to Carol Burnett, Carol Channing and Carole Bayer Sager” (1998); and “Unforgettable: Fashion of the Oscars, Christie’s benefit auction” (1999).

The series also documents Krim’s activities involving U.S. public policy, Senate Appropriations Committee testimony, the Food and Drug Administration, commercial drug manufacturers,

relationships with the Democratic Party, and the support of politicians. Records from the U.S. Presidential Medal of Freedom awarded to Krim by President Bill Clinton (2000) include press clippings, correspondence, and press releases.

Similar content was arranged by Krim's office as "Organizations, Foundations, Corporations, Issues and Causes associated with Dr. Krim" so may overlap with material in Subseries 2.4: Organizations.

Subseries 2.4: Organizations (26.5 boxes, 9.2 cubic feet), 1980s-2012

This subseries contains files arranged alphabetically by name of organization, foundation, corporations, issues or cause "associated with Dr. Krim." Loose materials were arranged in general alphabetical files.

Annual reports, correspondence, promotional materials, newsletters, booklets, promotional material and other publications, photographs, and DVDs document the breadth of institutions and individuals who engaged with Krim and amfAR, the bulk relating directly with AIDS research, treatment, education, and patient advocacy. International in scope, records include ACT UP, African American AIDS Policy and Training Institute, Callen-Lorde Community Health Center, Drug Policy Alliance, GMHC founder Larry Kramer, the Institute of Medicine, National Association of People with AIDS, Ford Foundation, Kaiser Family Foundation, Senator Ted Kennedy, and Lasker Foundation, among many others.

Organizations may overlap with events found in Subseries 2.3: Events and 2.5: Subject Files.

Subseries 2.5: Subject files (17.5 boxes, 6 cubic feet), 1981-2014

This subseries contains press clippings, articles and other publications, reports, promotional information, correspondence, memoranda, notes and other materials regarding topics, individuals and organizations.

Of note is documentation of Krim's and others' efforts in lobbying the U.S. Congress. Contains transcript of testimony by Elizabeth Taylor before the U.S. Senate Labor, Health and Human Services, Education Appropriations Subcommittee May 8, 1989 to ask for an increased budget for AIDS. Also contains letter from Sen. Edward Kennedy to Mathilde Krim, thanking her for her help in passage of S. 1220, the AIDS Research, Information and Care Act of 1987 (letter April 29, 1988).

A 1991 letter from Lady Bird Johnson to the Krims contains an accompanying photo of Lady Bird with pressed wildflowers.

Arranged alphabetically.

SERIES III. PERSONAL, 1948-2013 (13.5 cubic feet)

BOX NUMBERS 32-34, 143- 165, 173-177, 179-182

This series of records documents Krim's personal life not specifically associated with her professional positions at Sloan-Kettering Institute and amfAR. It is organized into seven

subseries: 3.1. General, 3.2. Awards and artifacts, 3.3. Correspondence, 3.4. Scrapbooks, 3.5. Speeches, 3.6. Audiovisual, and 3.7. Writings.

Subseries 3.1: General (2.5 boxes, 1 cubic feet), 1958-2012

Contains records relating to Mathilde Krim's overall professional career, such as resumes, appointment letters, biographies, social contacts and appointment books; personal records such as passports and visas; programs and invitations; financial and organizational records relating to the Arthur and Mathilde Krim Foundation; and other records involving family, friends, and the household.

Of note is the marriage Ketubah for Arthur and Mathilde Krim.

Arranged alphabetically.

Subseries 3.2: Awards and artifacts (6 boxes, 4 cubic feet), 1964-2011

Certificates, plaques, medals, a scrapbook, and other objects given to Mathilde Krim to honor her work, and including other artifacts, such as the female condom. Includes several honorary degrees. Although she received the U.S. Presidential Medal of Freedom in 2000, Krim's papers do not contain the medal.

Packaged condoms may be found in other series, such as the oversized *Spin* magazine article "Beating AIDS: How a controversial treatment, typhoid vaccine, is saving lives" and with "free condom inside" found in Series II, Subseries 2.5: Subject files. Folder: Spin Magazine (Bob Guccione, Jr.), 1988.

Other documentation relating to awards can also be found in Subseries 3.3. Correspondence, 3.4. Scrapbooks, 3.5. Speeches, and Series IV: Photographs.

Arranged alphabetically.

Subseries 3.3: Correspondence (5 boxes, 1.2 cubic feet), 1960s-2011

This subseries contains correspondence marked "personal" (1969-1985) along with a smaller portion marked "general" (1970-1971), arranged chronologically, in addition to other correspondence not specifically relating to her work at Sloan-Kettering Institute or amfAR.

Subseries 3.4: Scrapbooks (12 boxes, 4.5 cubic feet), 1960-2011

This subseries contains letters, magazines, newspaper clippings and other articles, photographs, compact disks and/or DVDs, reports, greeting cards, invitations, brochures, programs, printouts of email messages and websites and other printed material collected and arranged by Krim into scrapbooks by year and/or subject. Documents Krim's life and accomplishments, such as her work with Interferon cancer research at Sloan-Kettering Institute; the history of amfAR, such as galas and associated individuals; and her personal friendships and family members. The bulk therefore documents the history of the AIDS epidemic. Material was held in files and folders, not bound volumes.

Magazines and newspaper articles are also found in Series II.

Subseries 3.5: Speeches (1 box, .35 cubic feet), 1972, 1996-2012

This subseries contains typescripts, notes and drafts of talks, opening remarks, introductions, and lectures from galas, symposia, press conferences, meetings, fund raisers, and other events, written and given by Mathilde Krim, the bulk related to HIV/AIDS advocacy and amfAR. Arranged chronologically.

Speeches are also found throughout the collection, particularly in Subseries 2.3: Events and Subseries 3.4: Scrapbooks.

Subseries 3.6: Audiovisual (4 boxes, 1 cubic feet), 1976-2002

Audio recordings and video recordings relating to HIV/AIDS and Krim's work at amfAR. Includes amateur recordings of popular broadcast television, such as the *Crossfire* television episode featuring Terry Beirn--a staff member in the U.S. Senate Committee on Labor and Human Resources who is credited for gaining the support needed to pass legislation which established the first national AIDS prevention campaign--the AIDS Research and Information Act of 1988--in addition to the 1990 Ryan White Care Act which provided services to low-income HIV-positive persons.

Subseries 3.7: Writings (5 boxes, 2 cubic feet), 1948-2013

Contains typescripts, reprints, and other text forms authored by or about Krim, as well as writings by others that do not pertain specifically to her work at Sloan Kettering and amfAR.

Other writings are found in in Subseries 3.5: Speeches, and in Series I and II.

SERIES IV. PHOTOGRAPHS. 1940s-2012 (11 boxes, 4 cubic feet)

BOX NUMBERS 165-171, 173, 175, 177-179, 182

Black-and-white and color photographic prints including photographer's proofs and contact sheets, negatives, and slides documenting Mathilde Krim, her friends and family; activities held within the Krim residences in Manhattan and in upstate New York; the Interferon Project and laboratory at Sloan-Kettering Institute; Arthur and Mathilde Krim with others and at events; amfAR benefits and other AIDS related events.

Of note are photographs of celebrities such as Elizabeth Taylor receiving the Prince of Asturias Concordia Prize; and photographs of politicians such as Hubert Humphry, Lyndon B. and Lady Bird Johnson, Jimmy Carter, and Bill Clinton. With ties to the Democratic Party and film industry, many photographs document parties hosted at the Krim residence for personal and fundraising purposes, depicting politicians, AIDS activists, and artists.

Of note is a photograph album containing black-and-white and color photographs of the Krims and John F. Kennedy, Hubert Humphrey, Lyndon B. and Lady Bird Johnson and others. Additional and duplicate images may be found throughout the collection.

Similar correspondents and topics compliment material found in Series I. Some correspondence covers her AIDS and AMF-related work.
