Notes, 1850-1851, of an unknown medical student on the “institutes of medicine” (physiology) lectures given by a Dr. Jackson, probably Samuel Jackson (1787-1872). Jackson was professor of the institutes of medicine at the University of Pennsylvania medical school at this time.

This notebook was purchased with a [manuscript formulary](#) as a set for the [Hyman Collection in the History of Anesthesiology](#). However, though both notebooks originate in Philadelphia and date from the same time, it is not clear if they were produced by the same person; the handwriting does not appear similar.
