COLUMBIA UNIVERSITY. DEPARTMENT OF NEUROLOGICAL SURGERY. Operation log books, 1933-1938, 1946-1957. 9 volumes (1.25 cubic feet)

HISTORICAL NOTE: Surgery was an important part of the work of the Neurological Institute of New York from its founding in 1909. It became part of the Columbia-Presbyterian Medical Center at its opening in 1928 and was merged into Presbyterian Hospital in 1943. The Neurological Institute also served as the department of neurology for the Columbia University College of Physicians and Surgeons. A separate department of neurological surgery was not established until 1949. J. Lawrence Pool was its first chairman (1949-1972).

SCOPE AND CONTENT: Records of neurological surgery undertaken at the Columbia-Presbyterian Medical Center, 1933-1938, 1946-1957. Information is recorded in tabular form and always includes name of patient, operation number, date, type of operation, surgeons' names, and anesthetic employed. In a smaller number of cases, the result, post-op diagnosis and pathological findings are recorded.

LANGUAGE: English.

ACCESS: Because the papers include Confidential Health Information (CHI) as defined by Columbia University policies governing data security and privacy, access is allowed only under the terms of Archives and Special Collections' <u>Access Policy to Records Containing</u> Confidential Health Information.

PROVENANCE: Transfer from the Columbia University Department of Neurological Surgery, May, 2017 (acc. #2017.009).

RELATED RECORDS: Archives and Special Collections also holds the department's operating room schedules for 1950-1995, which generally have less information than the logbooks.
